- In 1999, the Water Assembly published the Regional Water Budget.
- Bottom line: from 1972-1997, the region had averaged consuming 15-20% more than is renewed. Some studies say more.
- The 2004 Regional Water Plan was developed to close that deficit gap.
- Much has happened since. Is it enough?
- What happens if we continue on our present course? What are the economic, agricultural, ecological, demographic, legal and, yes, hydrological implications of our current course?
- We'll present a water budget updated to 2010 and a "State of the Region - 2025" report developed by a multi-disciplinary expert team during at the Assembly event.

Come look at a likely regional future based upon our current policies; find out what may well have occurred, looking back from 2025. If you're disturbed with how it will look ... THEN, discuss with us if and how to envision a better future, and to take action to get there.
