Tying New Mexico's economy to need for environmental restoration. Engaging local communities and under- (or un-) employed demographics into positive, change-creating work iyin their own communities and ecosystems (forest restoration, road ripping, etc.)

Look to cases outside the basin for innovative strategies – i.e., Australia

- Rainwater harvesting policy/governance – Australia
- Stormwater management/ reuse – Australia

Increase floodplain connectivity – for resilience

Move away from path-dependent technologies – zero desalination

Reuse greywater, recycle effluent
